Brixham: is one of the three towns that make up Torbay. In addition to the Golden Hind, Brixham has a large working harbour.

Cockington Court: is a gorgeous manor house located above a traditional English village.



Dartington Hall: was built in 1388 for John Holland, the half-brother of Richard II.



Kent's Cavern: is a cave system running under Torquay. It is notable for both archaeological and geological features.

The South Hams: is a picturesque coastal area and an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.



West Cornwall: has some of the best attractions in the country including the cliffs around Land's End and the artists' haven of St Ives.



Agatha Christie Museum: she was a world famous crime novelist and the best-selling author of all time. She grew up and lived in Torquay.



Buckfast Abbey: forms part of a Benedictine monastery founded in 1018 until it was destroyed in the Dissolution of the Monasteries.



Coast Fishing: see if you can tempt some of our little fishy friends to attach themselves to a large hook.



Coleton Fishacre: is a wonderful Arts and Crafts-style house with Art Deco interiors and beautiful gardens.



Golf - Pitch & Putt: a relaxing, but competitive, game of nine hole golf on Torre Abbey Meadow.

Greenway House: was the home of Agatha Christie and has now been restored and opened to visitors by the National Trust.
