School Facilities

Conveniently situated in the city centre within a 10-minute walk from the main shops and sports centres, the Globe's beautifully modernised 19th century buildings offer excellent facilities. We are surrounded by trees and gardens with lovely views over the Exe Valley.

Administration

Classrooms

Each classroom is comfortably equipped and has a whiteboard, a television and a DVD and CD player which are integrated into the teaching programme.

Self-study

We have a resources room and a computer room, open 08.30-17.00, where you can borrow books, DVDs, practise your pronunciation and use the latest materials to improve your English. All students are offered a free self access orientation in week 1. Free monthly workshops give you further opportunities to develop your skills.

Information Technology

There is free Wi-Fi throughout the school, a computer in every classroom, a computer room and a private study room with computer and web cam that students can book for personal use. IT is integrated into all lessons.

Terraces and garden

For families

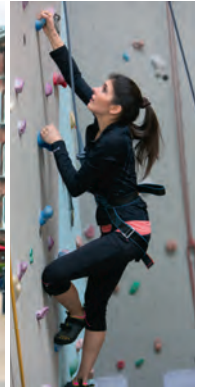

Methodology and Teachers

Adult programmes have a maximum of 6 students per class. Personalised tuition and an interactive, creative syllabus ensure that, even on a short course, students' individual needs are met and good progress is made.

Teachers

All our teachers are native speakers and trained in teaching English as a Foreign Language. Dynamic and approachable, they are expert in motivating students and identifying their needs. They generate interest in lessons with the latest teaching techniques. Regular staff training guarantees a high standard in all our programmes.

The first day

- On arrival at 9.00 you will have a grammar test and an interview to assess your level and select the correct class for you.
- Testing is followed by a tour of the School facilities and Self-Study Centre and a presentation of the Social Programme.
- After a short break, classes will begin at 11.00 (except on bank holidays).

The Course Director meets all students in their first week to see if they are satisfied with their class level, accommodation and programme in general.

You are always welcome to approach any staff for help at any time.



Progress testing

All students receive a written assessment of their progress at the end of their course.

Long stay students take a progress test on the first Monday of every month during class hours, followed by a tutorial with their class teacher to assess their English and to advise them on areas for further study.

Learning and homework

Homework is set daily and we recommend you take advantage of our Self-study Centre to consolidate the work done in the classroom and further improve your language skills.

To make as much progress as possible, we advise you to practise English both in and out of class, with other students, your host family and British people.

Examinations

We offer advice on the best internationally recognised English examinations for your professional life or entrance to a British university. We can help you with your application and the interview process so that you are as well prepared as possible.

Certificates

At the end of your course you receive a Globe English Centre Certificate of Attendance and a written report on your progress, including an assessment of your abilities and advice on further study.

Expected Progress On average students move up four Globe levels during an academic year. If a student comes to us as a 'Beginner' we would expect them to reach 'Upper-Intermediate' within a year. However, this is only a guideline. Not all students progress at the same rate.

University Admissions British Universities and Colleges usually require the FCE or IELTS score 5.5 for admission on their Foundation Programmes and the CAE or CPE or IELTS 7.5 - 9, depending on the course, for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes.

Examinations

Intensive 2 week Cambridge Course

This is an intensive exam preparation course focusing exclusively on exam techniques and working mostly from past papers.

Students have the option of taking the exam at the end of the course.

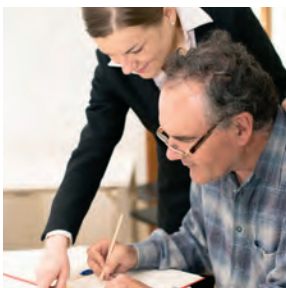

Teacher Training

With expertise in academic management, teaching, learning resources and course design, the Globe is an ideal choice for teachers wanting to develop their skills. Our courses have an element of choice built in allowing us to tailor the programmes to suit your specific needs. We offer courses for primary, secondary and adult teachers and in CLIL (Content and Language Integrated learning).

2 week option

Teachers join our general English programme in the morning allowing them to develop their language skills at their level. The afternoon methodology classes are practical and interactive, combining the latest methodology with ideas for classroom activities. Sessions include using authentic materials, CALL (Computer Assisted Language Learning), developing pronunciation skills and creativity in the classroom. Please contact us for dates.

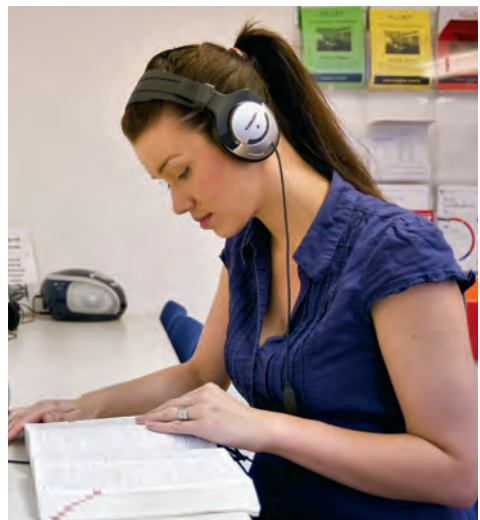

Online English

For students who prefer to study from the comfort of their own home or workplace, our online course offers one-to-one tuition with our specialist online tutor.

Each 4 week course offers a minimum of 12 hours face-to-face tutorials plus assignments and homework to complete in your own time. You can choose to focus on any area that suits you, for example grammar, pronunciation or Business English.

Once you have booked your course, our online tutor will contact you directly to arrange times that suit and to discuss course content.



Work Experience

For those wanting a more practical language experience, this programme combines a minimum of one week on one of our courses with a work placement in a local company. Participants must be 18 or over and have a minimum level B1 (Intermediate).

Possible placements include education, travel and tourism, hospitality and catering, social care and business.

Students on work placement have access to all Globe facilities and the Adult Social Programme as well as our accommodation service.



Family Programmes

Family groups from all over the world combine studying English with a family holiday at the Globe. Parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, cousins, everyone is welcome and can find a programme to suit their needs in our varied and attractive selection of courses.

The Junior School is situated next door to the Adult School so parents and younger children on Explorer Programmes can have breaks and lunches together. Whatever they choose to do, it is reassuring for parents and children to know that they are close by.

After class, adults can choose to study, join the Adult Social Programme or accompany their children on the Junior Social Programme. All youngsters enjoy a varied and fun filled activity programme and supervision is provided for 6-10 year olds during week days from 8.30-17.30 so that adults can have some free time or follow the programme of their choice.

The Globe can also recommend nursery schools (1-5 years old) or holiday camps for younger children who will have fun playing and learning alongside English children whilst the rest of the family enjoys our dynamic and creative programmes.



Mini Groups Closed Group Courses

EAP English for Academic Purposes

This programme is for students going on to higher education in the UK, who may have already achieved the correct level but who want to further develop their skills. The courses focuses on key academic skills such as note taking, essay writing, academic research and presentations. All participants must have a minimum level of IELTS 5.5 / FCE / B2.



Exam Preparation

Available for IELTS, TOEIC, TOEFL, Trinity graded exams in spoken English (GESE) and all Cambridge exams. This course focuses solely on exam techniques and includes a full mock exam. Students wishing to take the exam in the UK should contact us for dates.

Vocational and Business programme

This is a course for colleagues working in the same field and is designed to meet their specific needs.

The course focuses on language relating to their field of study and can include visits to local companies.

Past programmes include: English for the aviation industry, for travel and tourism; hotel and catering; engineering; health and social care; advertising and marketing.

Over 50s programme

A skills based conversation course, combining language classes with cultural visits and trips. This is ideal for those who want to improve their English while discovering the beautiful South West region. - We visit our families and carefully select them for the comfort of their homes, their kindness and the quality of their welcome. Many of our families are personally known to our staff. Please write your accommodation requirements clearly on your enrolment form.
- Most families are within 30 minutes/2.8kms of the Globe. We will give you a free bus pass if you are further than 2.8km. All families are on a bus route..
- Students of the same mother tongue are not placed with the same family unless they request to stay with a friend.
- Students have their own room with a writing table and are offered breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal. Cooked lunches can be heated up at school.
- Families will offer to do some light laundry on a weekly basis.
- Host family Plus guarantees a higher standard of accommodation and welcome.
- Private bathrooms must be requested if required.
- Our families follow the English UK Code of Practice in accordance with the British Council and British Authorities' recommendations.
- If a student has any difficulties or problems with their host family, we will do our best to improve the situation and will change the host family, if necessary.

Hotels

Exeter and the surrounding countryside offer a wide range of hotels which we are happy to recommend. There is a good selection within 5 minutes' walk from school.



Private and shared apartments

The Globe has access to a number of self-catering apartments in the city centre, as well as 10 apartments on the school campus. Some are shared apartments where each student has their own room and some are suitable for families. All apartments are fully equipped. Heating, electricity, linen, TV and free WiFi are included.

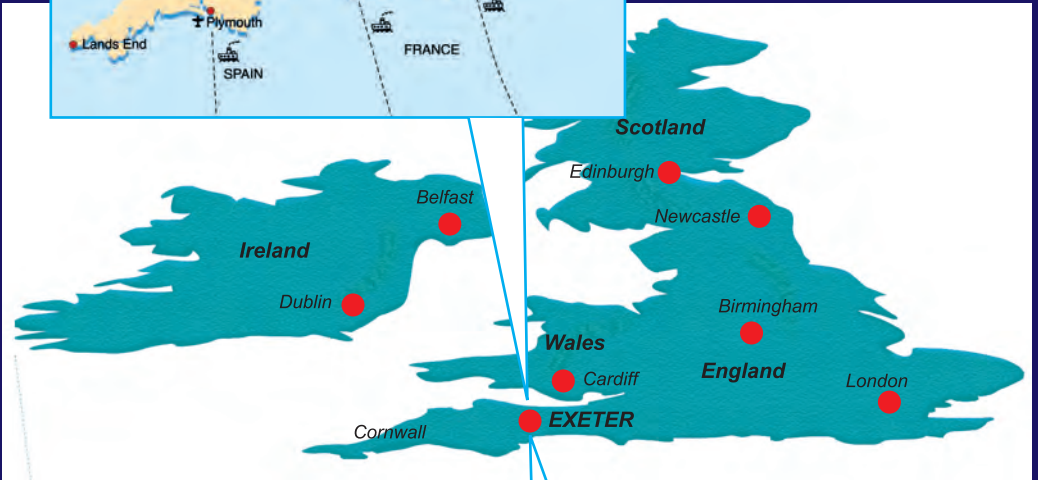
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
