

THE SCHOOLS

Experienced

One of the longest-established English language schools in Britain, we have been part of Cambridge's education scene since 1954. We are well known and respected in Cambridge.

Independent and privately owned

Studio Cambridge is not part of a chain of schools. We are privately owned and managed.

All of our central services – such as Accommodation, Welfare, Activities staff, Academic Manager, Directors of Studies and the school Directors – are based at our main school in Cambridge.

In this way, we all get to meet and to know our students and are able to respond quickly without needing to contact "head office".

Big but friendly

Although we are not a small school, we treat our students as individual people.

We typically have between 180 and 250 students at school each day. This is an ideal size because:

- We usually have at least 12 classes running at the same time, so can teach at all levels from beginner to advanced
- ✓ You will meet fellow students from countries all over the world (see "Student nationalities" page 6)
- We can organise a wide variety of social, sports and cultural activities – which are free of charge
- We can give you our personal attention in all aspects of your stay at Studio Cambridge

In addition to Intensive courses, we run our Sir George English Camp for ages 14-17 years at the Main School during the academic year (August to June) – see page 29. This programme sometimes shares classes with young adult students taking the EFL – 28 course.

Thus, if you are studying on our Intensive English EFL – 28 course and you are aged

- 16 17 years, some of your classmates may be aged 14 or 15
- 18 + years, all your classmates will be aged at least 16+ years

The average age of students taking our Intensive English courses is 23 years.

Accessibility for students

Our main school in Cambridge is in 150 year-old buildings, with four floors and no lifts. We unfortunately, therefore, have no facilities for people using wheelchairs. Accessibility to our summer centre at Hills Road Sixth Form College is better, but limited.

Please let us know before you enrol if you have any special needs. We will be able to advise you on the suitability of our schools, courses, activities and accommodation for your particular requirements.








Student nationalities

Two premises in Cambridge

1. Our main school, during the academic year

Our main school, including our management offices, is open year-round. It is located in impressive 19th century buildings belonging to Cambridge University

Classes are held here during the academic year (January to June and August to December).

The school is just 15 minutes' walk from the centre of Cambridge and 3 minutes' from the main railway station, from where there are frequent train services to London.

The main school has:

- 22 classrooms
- Learning Centre, with library, multimedia facilities and free Internet access
- ✓ Free Wi-Fi
- Director of Studies Office for help and advice with academic work
- Café for snacks, drinks and hot or cold lunches
- Garden
- Accommodation Office
- Student Services Department for activities and excursions
- Welfare Department with qualified welfare personnel

2. Our summer school (July and August)

In the summer, classes are held in the renowned Hills Road Sixth Form College (HRSFC).

HRSFC is one of the most outstanding schools in Britain, sending more students to Oxford and Cambridge universities than any other state college in Britain.

It is just 10 minutes' walk from our main school and has excellent, modern facilities, including:

- 20 classrooms
- Computer suites with free Internet access
- Free Wi-Fi
- Director of Studies Office for help and advice with academic work
- Cafeteria for snacks, drinks and hot or cold lunches
- Student Services Office for activities and excursions
- Garden

We have been teaching at HRSFC every summer since 2005.









ACCOMMODATION

Homestays - living with local people

Living with a host family in their private home - a homestay - is the best way to experience British culture at first hand.

All our hosts are known to us personally and we visit all of them at least once every year. They provide a friendly environment, a clean and comfortable bedroom, good food, and a quiet place for study.

Homestays are normally located less than 40 minutes from school on foot, by bicycle or using the frequent bus services. Our hosts are typical of British and Cambridge society as a whole: of different ages and occupations and from a variety of ethnic and cultural backgrounds.

If we place another student in your homestay, he or she will not be a native speaker of your language, so your only means of communication will be English.

There are three types of homestay accommodation:

- Homestay Three Star Good, clean accommodation.
- ✔ Homestay Four Star As above, but of a particularly high standard, in a larger home or with additional facilities.
- ✓ Homestay Five Star Executive-standard, usually in a large house and typically providing a bathroom for your private use. Available exclusively to students aged 18 or more years.

Your bedroom, laundry and meals

- ✓ You will have your own private (single) room
- ✓ Shared rooms are available for couples
- ✓ Your clothes will be washed once per week
- ✓ Your bed linen and towels will be changed once per week
- ✓ Your homestay hosts will provide you with 19 meals per week.
 - Breakfast and dinner every day; and
 - Lunch on Saturdays and Sundays

A hot or cold lunch is available every day from Monday to Friday in the school café at additional cost.

Residential Accommodation

If you are aged 18 years or more, you may choose accommodation in a residence. This will give you more privacy and independence than a homestay. However, it does require that:

- ✓ You buy and cook your own meals
- ✓ You wash your own clothes
- You pay a deposit of £100 on arrival and be responsible for damages.

You will share the residence with other students and you will be expected to be mature and responsible. You must keep your bedroom and other parts of the residence clean and tidy

There are three student residences available. Prices are from £225 per week:

Year- round at "Tripos Court"

Tripos Court is a modern, purpose-built student apartment complex. It has a high standard of facilities and a young, lively international atmosphere. It is just a few minutes' walk from a cinema, bowling, gym, bars and restaurants

Summer at CB1

These are two large, modern student residences next door to each other. They are just 5 minutes' walk to our main school and Hills Road Sixth Form College and 15 minutes' to the centre of Cambridge.

The residences are in an area called "CB1" which is designed specifically for students, with shops, bars and restaurants, cinema, bowling, gym, bars and restaurants.

The city of Cambridge

Our city is known throughout the world for its mediaeval university colleges, impressive architecture, the peaceful River Cam, and its green parks and gardens. With its historic buildings and beautiful setting, the city of Cambridge is the ideal place in which to learn English.

But Cambridge is not only about tradition; it is modern, too. With a population of 100,000 residents and 20,000 university students, Cambridge is an exciting place in which to live and study. It is small enough to get around easily on foot or by bicycle, but big enough to have all the shops, restaurants, cinemas, theatres, clubs, museums, galleries and sporting facilities that you may need.

Of course, if you want to visit a really big city, London is just 45 minutes away by train.

Our main school is just 15 minutes' walk from Cambridge's historic centre, and our summer school is 20 minutes' walk away.

There are also direct trains from Cambridge to London's Stansted Airport which offers cheap flights to 30 countries in Europe and throughout the world.

ACTIVITIES - FREE OF CHARGE

At least five free activities each week

To take full advantage of living with us here in the UK, you must continue to speak English after your classes are finished for the day, and you should learn as much as you can about our way of life.

To help you do that we offer at least five afternoon activities, and one evening activity, each week, completely free of charge. A sample of these activities is opposite.

Join in – and you will find yourself using your English with friends from around the world and in normal daily situations. You will be using the English you have learned in the classroom.

We have some other clever ways of keeping you talking. For example:

Studio "missions"

We might ask you to interview some Cambridge University students about their life at university, or take some selfies with local people, or make a video while walking – or "punting" – around Cambridge. All of this will get you meeting people, talking and listening.

Conversation Club

Each week we invite you to our free "Conversation Club". Here you can talk with other Studio Cambridge students from different parts of the world, with different backgrounds and different levels of English. A teacher will be on hand to make introductions and help with questions. All of this will get you talking and, who knows, making life-long friends.

Excursions and UK travel

It is easy to travel independently from Cambridge by train or coach to all destinations in the UK. There is direct transport to London, Birmingham, the seaside, and all of the London airports.

During the weekend, student excursions can be booked to destinations such as London, Stratford-upon-Avon, York, Bath, Canterbury, Windsor Castle, Warwick Castle, Salisbury and Stonehenge.

Longer trips to Scotland and other European countries on the continent also leave regularly from Cambridge.

These are all at extra cost. A full-day excursion to London, for example, costs approximately £22.00. Some excursions are available exclusively to students aged 18 years or more.

The Course

Our EFL 20 course is in general English, with no specialisation. It consists of 20 lessons each week, typically from 09:15 to 12:45 each day, Monday to Friday. It is ideal for students who prefer to have their afternoons free.

The content of the course differs according to the level of each class. However, all courses include the study of grammar, speaking and pronunciation, writing skills, and listening and reading comprehension.

Methodology

We adapt our teaching to the needs and learning styles of our students, following three guiding principles:

The teaching will be balanced with practice - you will learn and practise English, with an emphasis on speaking.

Lessons will be centred around you - you will not spend all your time listening to the teacher but will be busy using English in the classroom.

The language we teach will be recycled - we will not allow you to forget what you have learnt.

Lessons are linked to places and events around Cambridge and the UK

The heart of the EFL 28 Intensive Course

Students taking our EFL 28 course (see pages 13-16) take the EFL 20 course during the mornings and then study from a choice of options in the afternoons.

*Ages: Some of your classmates may, therefore, be 16 or 17 years of age.

Tests – Placement, Progress and End-of-course

On the first day of your course you will take a written and oral test to allow us to assess your knowledge of English and so to place you in a class at the right level for you.

At the end of each week you will take another test to make sure that you have understood the work done during the week and that you are continuing to improve. The test also allows us to confirm whether your current class is still at the right level for you.

Before you leave us, you will be able to take an end of course test, to show your progress over the whole course.

Modern technology

Lessons regularly incorporate modern media, including listening exercises based on Internet sources, video clips and the latest news. All our classrooms have WiFi, data projectors and speakers.











Interesting teachers

Members of our teaching team have many years' experience of TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) at Studio Cambridge, and often at other schools, colleges and universities in the UK and overseas.

Between them, they also have academic backgrounds in Philosophy, English Literature, IT, Sciences, Psychology, Law, Business, Politics, Accountancy, History and more.

Tutorials

A tutorial is a private meeting with your teacher, in which you can discuss the progress you have made and what you need to do next to reach your goals.

Your Study Plan

Based on the personal goals identified in your tutorials and your work in class, your teacher will give you a personalised Study Plan. This will guide you to work on those areas of English which you need to focus on to improve your command of the language.

Self-study in the Learning Centre

You can visit our Main School Learning Centre before or after lessons to work on the areas identified in your Study Plan. It has 20 PCs with free internet access and Wi-Fi, and a range of materials including CDs, books and newspapers.

Certificate of Studies and Academic Report

At the end of your course you will receive a certificate showing the course you have studied and the dates of that course.

Your main teacher will also write a personalised Academic Report which shows not just your progress but also the level you have attained in each area of English. This is a very useful document for your future studies or work.

The EFL-20 and EFL-28 courses cost less per week the longer you study. See our Dates and Fees list for information. If you are staying for 6 weeks or more, you can move from the EFL 28 course to our examination courses as you progress in your studies











English + 5 specialised afternoon options

The EFL 28 course is the most effective way to improve your English in the shortest possible time.

1. Intensive

The course includes

- ✓ 28 lessons (21 hours of 60 minutes) of teacher-led instruction in the classroom
- ✓ homework and out-of-class assignments
- ✓ optional study in the Learning Centre
- private meetings with your teacher (tutorials)
- optional conversation club practice each week

In addition to your formal lessons, you will be taking part in social activities with fellow students from around the world – and speaking English with them – and you will be living in a homestay or residence where the only means of communication will be English. Who knows? Soon you might be dreaming in English!

2. Demanding

The lessons are dynamic: they require you to be involved and to use your fast-developing mastery of the language in the classroom. You will not just sit quietly taking notes.

The English being taught will be at your level, and classes are small: a maximum of 16 students and an average of 13 in each class. Personal attention is assured. Weekly progress tests and regular tutorials will ensure that you are challenged to do your personal best.

3. Specialised

With the assistance of your teacher or the Director of Studies, you can choose the afternoon option / specialisation which is most useful for you and relevant to your needs and interests (see pages 15 and 16).

For example:

Option 2 – Cultural and Linguistic Studies – if you want to learn more about media, British history or work more on your grammar

Tutorials



ACTIVITIES

THE TOWN


