


# **Academic Content**

### **English Foundation Courses**

The general English syllabus is created by the Oxford International and Bucksmore Academic team, and it is designed specifically for junior students in a summer school environment. It covers all levels from Elementary to Proficiency. All students on a two-week English Foundation course take the Bucksmore Assessment, providing them with a grade comparable to leading industry exam boards. Students on English 'Plus' courses enjoy additional workshops led by specialist external providers.

### Academic Enrichment Courses

Academic Enrichment programmes focus on key leadership, academic, and professional skills. The syllabuses are updated and refreshed each year to ensure they are in line with current events and cutting-edge ideas. The Young Leaders syllabus is created by the Bucksmore Academic team and has previously been shortlisted for the prestigious British Council ELTons award. Young Professionals content is designed with help from expert tutors in each of the specialist vocational fields.



### **University Experience Courses**

University Experience programmes are suitable for native and high-level English speakers. The content is very specialised and the level is designed to reflect the first year of university in the chosen subject. Tutorials are delivered by expert tutors, who range from further education professionals to PhD candidates. The tutorial structure is based on the Oxbridge learning system, and each student will also receive 1:1 sessions in each chosen subject.

### Welfare

Every Bucksmore location has a residential management team, and a minimum staff-student ratio of 1:7. There is always a trained first aider onsite, and students are supervised 24 hours a day.

### **Airport Transfers**

### Overview of Bucksmore syllabus: Intensive English classes & 21st Century Skills

### Language Study

Through topics specifically designed for junior learners, the syllabus focuses on contemporary English. It integrates all language skills but focuses on speaking and listening. Students work on grammar as well as lexical areas in a modern-day context. Language study supplies the building blocks students need to communicate successfully with native and non-native speakers.

### Language in Use

Students are put in real-life situations to communicate in a meaningful and authentic way. This allows students to activate the language found in their course books in an everyday scenario. Language in Use classes develop fluency and communication skills, building students' confidence and knowledge of English.

**Excursion Link Lessons** 

Before full-day excursions, students learn about the destinations they are about to visit. Lessons cover local history, culture of the area and vocabulary relating to the landmarks they will see.



### Projects and mini-projects

Project sessions encourage group work and co-operation across all levels of English. Students are encouraged to work collaboratively, completing shared tasks by using English with an authentic purpose. Each weekly project ends with a presentation evening, during which all groups display and present their work.

#### Academic Skills

The academic skills classes give students an introduction to exam techniques and are intended to help students improve the skills of academic reading, writing, listening and speaking. These sessions culminate with students taking the Bucksmore Assessment.

#### Electives

After arriving, students sign up for a choice of vocational subjects to enhance their English usage through different topics such as creative writing, and IELTS preparation. Note - exact subjects vary slightly between Oxford and London.

Designed in line with UK independent school teaching methodology, Boarding School Preparation introduces students to life at a British boarding school, providing the skills, experience and confidence students need to thrive in the UK independent school system.

The curriculum covers the three core subjects in British schools; English Language and Literature, Mathematics and Science, with lessons in each subject giving students a head-start in their studies upon arrival at school in the UK. The syllabus also includes 'Entrance Test Preparation' sessions (e.g. UKiset), which develop aptitude, interview and reasoning skills while preparing students for all common entrance exam areas and the rigorous application processes they may face when applying to a UK independent school.
